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Here are some activities to try at home
to reinforce what we are learning in school.

Literacy at Home

Letter Search

Point out familiar signs and labels (stop signs, railroad signs, store signs, cereal box labels, toy labels).

Print some familiar store signs off the computer and tape them to blocks. Play with your child creating/building a shopping center using the signs to label the stores.

Go on a search for the letter that begins your child's first name. Look at food boxes, in books, on clothing, toys, and equipment around your house that is labeled. Find something that is shaped like a pointer and when they find their letter, they can point to it and yell, "GOTCHA!"

Math at Home

Count items at snack time, play time, bath time, or riding in the car.

Point out numbers on signs, the T.V., the clock, on price tags at the store, and on their toys.

Provide a calendar for your child. Let them cross off each day when it arrives.

They can count down how many days to a birthday or special holiday.

Taking Care of Me at Home

I can wash my hands: There are many steps to washing hands: turning on the water, getting soap, scrubbing hands, rinsing hands, turning off the water, getting a towel, drying hands, and throwing away the paper towel.

Help your child learn how and when to wash and dry his/her own hands.

Remind them they need to wash after using the bathroom, before eating, and when their hands are dirty.

Model washing your hands and do it together as a fun way to reinforce this very important skill.

Rhyming Words

When riding in the car say, I'm going to say some silly rhyming words. Bat, jat,/ fat, zat,/ mat, lat, etc...You can talk about how the first word is a real word but the second word is a silly word. Continue with other pairs of words. pen yen/ men fen / Ben gen/ ten ren hop dop/ stop rop/ mop gop/ cop vop / pop fop After you've done this for a while, have them repeat after you. Soon they might even want to give you their own silly rhyming word.
